Christians come together for essential elements involved in living the christian life. As stated in Acts 2:41, *“Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them. 42 And they continued steadfastly in the apostles’ doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers.”* The church is a fellowship that meets together to worship together, to pray together and to grow in the word together (Acts 20:7)! How could a Christian ever think there is really true living without being in the assemblies of the church (Hebrews 10:24-26)? Christians need the abundant life that is available by being in the fellowship of the Lord’s church (John 10:10). Living without the church is like living without food and water. It is as the Apostle Paul said, *“We are of all men most miserable” (1 Cor. 15:19).*

Are you living the abundant life in Christ? How about starting the year with the goal of attending all the assemblies of the church? How could we ever possibly say, “I don’t need the church?”

Can a Christian Live Without the Church?

So it was that for a whole year they assembled with the church and taught a great many people. And the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch. Acts 11:26

The answer to the question is YES. Someone who has obeyed the gospel plan of salvation can make the choice not to attend the worship assemblies of the church. They can even ignore that the church was established by Christ himself and live as if it has never existed. They may even forget what they were taught about the church before becoming a christian. Which brings us back to the question itself: Can a christian live without the church? Considering the question, what most people are actually asking is this: Does being a christian mean I have to attend the assembly of the church in order to go to heaven? Once again, the answer to this question is YES!

But what if I am sick or unable physically to attend the assembly of the church? Will God hold that against me? Most of us know the answer to that question. And clearly this is not the question we are considering. The question is this, can we remove ourselves from the existence of the church and live a faithful christian life? Consider what happens when a person obeys the gospel of Christ. Luke tells us, *“And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved” (Acts 20:7).* If a person obeys from the heart the requirements of the doctrine of Christ, then he is added as a member of Christ’s church. The apostle Paul explains that the church is the body of Christ when he states, *“And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, 23 which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all” Ephesians 1:22-23.* When we are baptized into Christ, we are baptized into Christ’s body, the church. This Paul clearly declared by inspiration of the Holy Spirit itself, *“For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body” 1 Corinthians 12:13.* And what is the body? It is the church! In Ephesians 5:23, Paul explains the inseparable aspect of the church to a christian’s salvation. *“For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body.”* What is a marriage like if a husband and wife live without each other? Can a faithful christian live without the church if we are joined to Christ?


