blasphemed Him, saying, 'If You are the Christ, save Yourself and us.'" The reason paradise was lost is obvious. This one did not believe that Jesus was who he claimed to be, the son of God. However, the man who learned God is good and paradise is a reality said these words, "'Do you not even fear God, seeing you are under the same condemnation? And we indeed justly, for we receive the due reward of our deeds; but this Man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said to Jesus, 'Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom'" (Luke 23:40-42). He obviously believed that Jesus was the Christ the son of God. This one recognized that Jesus was an innocent man and that Jesus was going to be King of his kingdom. Can you imagine the shock when Jesus said to this criminal, "Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43)? One man found Paradise while the other lost Paradise.

Jesus calls upon N.T. Christians to be "Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Rev. 2:10). If we are faithful and obedient to Christ, then we do so with the promise, "To him who overcomes I will give to eat from the tree of life, which is in the midst of the Paradise of God" (Rev. 2:7). Preacher Joe and his wife Pat lost their home and many irreplaceable possessions in Paradise. However, if they are faithful they will not lose the Paradise of God. It likely that none of us are planning on living in Paradise, California. However, are you planning on living in the Paradise of God?

Paradise Lost

Luke 23:43 And Jesus said to him, "Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise."

Paradise, California is a town in Butte County, about 80 miles north of the state capital of Sacramento and, up until recently, lived up to its designation about as much as any other similarly-named place in the United States. This Paradise is located in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Its altitude (about 1,700 feet) positions it high enough to escape the California valley heat in the summer, yet low enough in elevation as to stay below the heavy winter snowfalls that crest the mountain range. The climate and soil are just right for growing a variety of vegetables, fruits, and nut crops, leading Paradise to once possess the title of "the apple center of California." Thus, if you love apple pie, then Paradise is the place, or I should say, was the place! Unfortunately, Paradise was lost. In the early part of November, a California wildfire known as the "Camp Fire" made its mark in California history. The "Camp Fire" is now the state's deadliest and most destructive wildfire on record, causing at least 63 deaths and destroying more than 12,000 structures. The ravaging blaze scorched more than 142,000 acres, an area more than four times the size of San Francisco.

I personally had not paid a lot of attention to the news about the wildfires in California because raging fire seems to be a common occurrence due to the dry brush, the wind and lack of rainfall. However, the loss of Paradise became a bit more real last Friday when I read some sad news in the online Christian Chronicle. The Chronicle reported that the fast-moving "Camp Fire" destroyed



the Paradise Church of Christ's building and most members' homes. They reported that the preacher, Joe Glenn, and his wife Pat, lost their home and the majority of their life long possessions. Ivan and Paula Todd certainly can sympathize with the Glenns much better than I. However, one of Joe Glenn's losses I can sympathize with more than some others. Brother Joe lost his preacher's

library that he had collected over a period of 60 years. Joe was quoted in the Chronicle, "I had a lot of Restoration books. For example, I had a signed copy of C.R. Nichol's "God's Woman." I had a signed copy of another one of his books. And I had all of his other books. I had an original of "Larimore and His Boys." I had a copy of Alexander Campbell's "The Living Oracles." And of course, I had all kinds of Bibles. I had written a book on marriage back in 1974, "Marriage Is for Husbands, Too," and I had several copies of that. They're all gone. My whole library is gone." The last quote in the article by preacher Joe starts with these words, "God is good. Paradise is lost. We are OK."

When Jesus hung on the cross with the two criminals hanging beside him, one of them would discover paradise lost. The other would learn that God is good and paradise was not lost. Luke quotes the man who lost paradise in Luke 23:39, "Then one of the criminals who were hanged
