Defining Love

And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma. Ephesians 5:2

Sandra sent Reader's Digest a story they published that tells how that suddenly and unexpected Sandra's father, then stationed at Camp Edwards in Massachusetts, received orders to prepare to ship out, and all leaves were canceled. However, being a young man very much in love, Sandra's father went AWOL. Sandra explained that her father and her mother were married four days earlier than originally planned and her father returned to base to an extremely angry sergeant. After hearing a long, impassioned, romantic, love-filled explanation and plea for mercy, the sergeant somewhat understandingly replied, "Okay, okay!" Then, as an afterthought the sergeant yelled and barked very loudly: "But don't let it happen again!" I suppose there is nothing like having a sergeant's barking orders for a life-long, love-filled marriage.

What does it mean to love? Does it mean we go AWOL to get married to a beautiful sweety that we feel we are in love with? Not a good plan. However, if you were to ask folks what is love, you would likely hear a lot of different answers. Volumes have been written to define and explain love. However, the best answer is the one that comes from the ancient volume, the Bible. The scriptures, by inspiration of God, tells us that *Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails (I Cor. 13:4-8).*

Scriptures reveal that love is more than mere feelings, though love involves feeling. Love is an intentional act of the will; love determines to put aside self and bless the object of its love. Love sacrifices. Love pays whatever cost, gives whatever gift, and runs whatever risk to do what is best for another. It gladly gives without complaint. Love will act even when difficult things are required. Love will bear the harsh and the demanding load of bearing with one another (*Ephesians 4:2*). Love even enables us to do what those of the world rarely do, forgive one another. Paul declares, Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave

against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. But above all
