Despite my struggle with pronunciation, the ability to sound out words is vital for others to understand what is spoken. The apostle Paul sternly told the Corinthian brothers that they needed to "sound it out" so that they could be understood. In I Corinthians 14:9, Paul states, "So likewise you, unless you utter by the tongue words easy to understand, how will it be known what is spoken? For you will be speaking into the air." He further explains the importance in verse 23, "Therefore if the whole church comes together in one place, and all speak with tongues, and there come in those who are uninformed or unbelievers, will they not say that you are out of your mind?"

When words are sounded out, it is not only vital that people understand the words, but that they hear "sound words!" This is why the apostle Paul declared to Titus, "But as for you, speak the things which are proper for sound doctrine" (Titus 2:1) because it is by "holding fast the faithful word as he has been taught, that he may be able, by sound doctrine, both to exhort and convict those who contradict" (Titus 1:9). The koine Greek word that is translated "sound" means that which is healthy, pure and uncorrupted. Sadly, Paul warned that some would pervert and corrupt the truth and not endure sound doctrine (II Timothy 4:3), which is why we must be determined to hold fast the pattern of sound words (II Timothy 1:13).

While I may not always sound out certain words with proper pronunciation, especially the koine Greek words, it is vital that I sound out sound words. Because when it comes to the gospel, it is important to "sound it out!!"

SOUND IT OUT

2 Timothy 1:13 Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus.

In the book of Job, Elihu speaks to Job some worthy words of truth: "Therefore listen to me, you men of understanding: Far be it from God to do wickedness, And from the Almighty to commit iniquity (Job 34:10). Then he follows in verse 16 with these words, "If you have understanding, hear this; Listen to the sound of my words."



The sound of words can be a monumental challenge. When I was in elementary school, or in other words, many moons ago, like many young students, pronouncing new vocabulary words was not a talent. Often the teacher would say to us less gifted students, "just sound it out". I would then attempt to "sound it out," but usually with similar results -

incorrectly. I am embarrassed to admit it, but I even struggled to pronounce the word "vocabulary". I am just glad I could sound out my vocabulary words without ever saying the word vocabulary! While taking Greek at the Northside School of Preaching, Brother Laverne Stewart introduced his koine Greek class by saying it is a dead language and not a spoken language. This gave a bit of relief because it was Greek to me! However, Brother Stewart followed that statement by saying that what his students would do is to "sound it out" by syllables. Talk about a sickening feeling; I felt like it was elementary school all over again.

And if that was not enough, later I went back to school at the University of Arkansas and took another koine Greek class. This two semester class was centered around reading the koine Greek in the classics like The Odyssey of Homer. Once again that old sick to the stomach feeling was back because each student was required to read out loud in each class session. And when it was my turn, this professor learned I must have failed miserably with vocabulary words. He would make a stern face and say loudly and distinctly, "sound it out!" This professor was an orthodox Jew and must have known well the words of Deuteronomy 1:34, "And the Lord heard the sound of your words, and was angry." So was this professor! However, Brother Stewart did well teaching the fundamentals and the mechanics of the koine Greek language. Thanks to him, I made a 100% on all the tests to the disdain of this Jewish Greek professor. But I knew I was struggling with pronunciation. Therefore, fearing failure at semester end, I felt it best to beg for mercy from the professor. To my surprise, he said he would give me an A for the class, but he didn't really want to do so because when it came to "sounding it out" I did so poorly.
