person rises from the watery grave to walk a new life with Christ and his church.



FRANKLY SPEAKING


Ralph Grant, in his book *Letters to the Seven Churches*, tells the story of the Franks during the Dark Ages. The Franks were a Germanic-speaking people who invaded the western Roman Empire in the 5th century. Dominating present-day northern France, Belgium, and western Germany, the Franks established what has been described as the most powerful kingdom of early medieval western Europe. The name France (Francia) is derived from their name, Franks. Historians tell that when the gospel came to Northern

Europe, large numbers of these Franks were being baptized. History reveals these people had been violent warriors for generations, so teaching them the ways of peace was frankly difficult. They were not sure they wanted to give up their savage fighting, so they went into the waters of baptism holding their battle



-axes up out of the water. They would say, "This hand has never been baptized!" The Franks were willing to make a commitment to Christ in some things, but would not give up their savage fighting. Of course, there's no such thing as baptizing "everything but the hand."

This story clearly indicates that Franks had a failure to understand the true meaning of repentance. They were willing to change only a part of their lives and not all of it. God doesn't want just some parts of us; He wants all of us. Repentance involves a complete change of will that says because I sincerely believe that God is and that Jesus is Lord, I am willing to give him my all without reservation. Isn't it interesting that baptism into Christ is an immersion of the entire person in water, not just part of us! Baptism is a reflection of total commitment to God. When a person is baptized into Christ for the remission of sins, it should be easy to sing the song, "All to Jesus I surrender, all to him I freely give!" Romans 6 and verse 4 says, "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." The whole person is buried and raised with Christ, the whole person has all his sins forgiven, and the whole
