

forgetful, “So I will be to them like a lion; Like a leopard by the road I will lurk; I will meet them like a bear deprived of her cubs; I will tear open their rib cage, And there I will devour them like a lion” (Hosea 13:7-8).

It is interesting that at The Tomb of the Unknown Soldiers, the sentinel guards command silence out of respect for the interred. Since midnight July 2, 1937, the memorial has been guarded continuously, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Inclement weather, terrorist attacks, et cetera, do not cause the watch to cease. The sentinel marches 21 steps across a black mat, past the final resting places of the Unknown Soldiers of World War I, World War II, Korea, and the crypt of the Unknown Soldier of the Vietnam War. We can be thankful that our nation remembers and honors those who sacrificed their lives for the freedom of others. However, how much more should we respect, honor and remember the great “I am” with obedience, dedication and faithful service? Are you a living honor to God? If not, remember what God said about a leopard, a bear and a lion, and that he was not talking about going to a zoo!

A Name to Remember

Hosea 12:5 “even Jehovah, the God of hosts; Jehovah is his memorial name. 6 Therefore turn thou to thy God: keep kindness and justice, and wait for thy God continually.” (asv)

Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States for remembering the people who died while serving in the country’s armed forces. “The holiday, which is currently observed every year on the last Monday of May, originated as Decoration Day after the American Civil War in 1868, when the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of Union veterans founded in Decatur, Illinois,



established it as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the Union war dead with flowers. By the 20th century, competing Union and Confederate holiday traditions, celebrated on different days, had merged, and Memorial Day eventually extended to honor all

Americans who died while in the military service” (Wikipedia). On the first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there. Also at Arlington is the The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier (or the Tomb of the Unknowns). This Tomb stands as a monument dedicated to U.S. service members who have died without their remains being identified. Although all unidentified war dead cannot be buried in Arlington, our nation nonetheless honors them all by including the remains of three representative soldiers of unknown identity who died in foreign wars (World War I, World War II, and Korean War). Like the other 400,000 graves at Arlington, this Memorial Day the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier will be officially decorated by the U.S. Army Military District of Washington with a Presidential Armed Forces Full Honor Wreath-Laying Ceremony.

In the book of Hosea, God declares that the people of Israel had forgotten the one and only God of heaven who brought Israel out of Egypt and made them a great nation in the land of Canaan. “When Israel was a child, I loved him, And out of Egypt I called My son. As they called them, So they went from them; They sacrificed to the Baals, And burned incense to carved images” (Hosea 11:1-2). Then the words are spoken, “My people are bent on backsliding from Me. Though they call to the Most High, None at all exalt Him” (Hosea 11:7). Unlike the soldiers buried in the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, they knew the name of God but they failed to remember, honor and exalt him. Hosea 12:5 declares that “Jehovah is his memorial name.” Jehovah, as transliterated in the ASV Bible, is a proper name in Hebrew and means “the I am; the eternal living one,” the one and only God of heaven. Israel had a tragic history of failure to memorialize the great “I am.” God declares these words in Hosea 13:6, “Therefore they forgot Me.” As a result, God declares his judgement upon the
