Bible studies with 1400 people in three villages. As a result, almost 200 souls have put the Lord on in baptism. These villages continue to be evangelized. During the second week of April, Bible studies began in a new town called Kajiado, where over 3,000 to 5,000 lost souls live. We hope to construct a church building for the new congregation in Kajiado soon.

7) During this first quarter four (4) church buildings have been constructed. Between all four congregations, there are over 150 members.


8) One of our goals for 2019 was the construction of a dormitory for those students attending the school of preaching. This dormitory is necessary to accommodate those students who wish to attend school but live too far away to commute daily. Construction of the dormitory is scheduled to begin at the end of April.

We hope that God will bless you in your work for Him as He has blessed this work in our report. We thank you for your prayers, cards, telephone calls, and donations. This is such an encouragement to us! Many times, the brethren in Kenya have expressed to us how much they appreciate the support that you have provided to them. They are very anxious to reach a point where they will become totally self-sufficient. Please pray for the work in Kenya among the Maasai.

### The Maasai Work in Kenya 2019

Acts 14:27 Now when they had come and gathered the church together, they reported all that God had done with them, and that He had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

In the first century, when the church came together, Paul and Barnabas gave a report of their work and how God had blessed them and opened the door of faith to the Gentiles. These reports served to encourage the brethren, strengthen their faith, and remind them of how important it is to share the gospel with the lost. We are thankful to be able to read reports from brethren and their work from around the world, especially from effective efforts that are being done among the Maasai people in Kenya. Below is the wonderful and encouraging report of the open door in Kenya sent to us by Brother Ralph Williams .

We thank our God for opening more doors of opportunity in this first quarter. Here is what has been accomplished in the first quarter of 2019:

1) In this first quarter, four (4) new congregations were started. This makes a total of 54 congregations that have been established since the work began in 2015. Our goal is to establish sixteen (16) new congregations by the end of 2019. 2) As of this first quarter, 4000 souls have been baptized since the work began. First, we want to give the glory and honor to God for this result and give recognition to our 42 trained preachers who have been diligently working in various villages spreading the gospel. (Our goal for 2019 is to teach and baptize another 1000 souls by the end of the year.)

3) A second medical clinic has been built and will be opening in two weeks.

4) A fourth elementary school will open the first of May with fifty (50) children enrolled. There are approximately 235 total children being instructed in all the elementary schools. (All of these schools are self-supporting.)

5) Our programs to help the Maasai Christians become self-supporting is proceeding very well.

-- The church now owns four plots of land totaling 20 acres. These properties are being used to grow beans, corn, and vegetables to help feed the children in the home, the students at the preaching school, elementary school children, and those Christians and community people impacted by famine. Currently, we have 3 wells that will provide irrigation to the properties. (A new barn was built to store our first harvest of beans. The first harvest produced ninety 100-lb. sacks of beans.)

, 10:30 AM -- Our program to own chickens and sell eggs is going well. Eggs are gathered daily, and some are sent to the

children's home and the preaching school. Surplus eggs are sold to the public. Two more chicken coops will be

built to enlarge our egg production. Recently, an incubator was purchased to care for new baby chicks.

-- Our 144 cattle, 200 goats, and 125 sheep continue to help support the needs of the children's home.

6) Forty-two (42) preachers teach the gospel in villages on Saturday. (A majority are in preaching school during the week.)

From January to the end of March, there were house
