The Perfect Father

Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.

Matthew 5:48

A Mr. Kent T. Critchlow, in Reader's Digest, tells the story of the time when his dad ran out of gas. Kent says his father called his mom to pick him up in her car. Together they went to a gas station, filled a can, and returned to Dad's car. After a few minutes, Dad got into Mom's car again, and said, "We need to go back to the gas station." Mom, of course, then asked, "One gallon wasn't enough?" Then Kent said his Dad responded, "It would have been if I'd put it in the right car."

Today is the day America has designated as Father's Day. A good many of us cherish fond memories of growing up with father. Father's Day gives us an opportunity to reflect upon "good ol' Dad" and show our heartfelt appreciation. Of course, not many of us could make the claim that we had the perfect father or, as a father, not too many of us would claim to be the perfect father. Having raised two wonderful daughters, if you were to ask them if their good ol' dad was the perfect dad, I know they would have to tell you, NO! They might even say



something like, "Our father was just like Mr. Critchlow's father, a man who made mistakes and most of them Mom could tell you about!" While I know my children love "good ol' Dad," I still wish I could go back and do some "raisin' kids" things over again. It seems like by the time I learned from my mistakes, the kids were grown.

Human fathers do make mistakes, but the great news is that we have a perfect Father in heaven. One of the real joys of being in Christ as a NT Christian is that we have been adopted by the perfect Father! Paul writes in Romans 8 starting with verse 13 " For if you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. 14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. 15 For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, 'Abba, Father.'" Because of the redemption by the blood of Jesus, we can be adopted children in Christ. The Hebrew writer tells us, "For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one, for which reason He is not ashamed to call them brethren" (Hebrews 2:11). When Jesus taught his disciples to pray, he said to them, "In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name" (Matthew 6:9). As the children of God, we have the privileged opportunity to speak to our father in heaven. Jesus said, "But you, when you pray, go into your room, and when you have shut your door, pray to your Father" (Matthew 6:6).
