**Navigating to a
SAFE PORT**

I remember reading in Acts 27:21-22 where the apostle Paul gave a warning to stop the ship because of the weather. Later when the situation became critical, he encouraged the sailors in the midst of the stormy sea. This event brings me to make a comparison between life in the sea and life in a family. In both cases, there are pleasant moments and difficult moments. While in the sea the struggles are against the waves, the bad weather, and sailors, and in a family the struggles are against the waves of life, the cultural shifts that move society, and sometimes, against the children and family. In both cases, it can be a challenge to reach a good safe harbor or port.

We live in difficult times in our society. Sin and worldly practices battle strongly against our Christian values trying to drag our children to the deep water of eternal punishment, just like it happened in the times of the Judges when the new generation was lost because their parents did not comply with the commandment of instructing their children when they walked by the way, when they lay down, and when they rose up (Deut. 6:6-7). This evil has regrettably entered the home of some preachers who, while doing a good job preaching the Gospel, they’ve lost their children because of not setting aside a time to teach the Word to their families. Those who deal with God’s wisdom are not able to apply it to their own families. They are like inexperienced captains who lose their precious crew for whom they are responsible.

Carrying the weight of guiding a family is not easy, but with God’s help, it is possible. We must eagerly seek to put into practice God’s advice in our families and in the Bible School of the Americas. This year we have implemented a program called “Living the Word.” It seeks to create well-established habits in each of our students and families. It involves each family having a ten minute devotional in their homes before going to sleep and studying a passage every evening, 365 days a year.
