Paul wrote to the Galatians and said. "But before faith came, we were kept under the law, shut up unto the faith which should afterwards be revealed. Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster" (Galatians 3:23-25 kiv). When Christ came, went to the cross and was resurrected, the usefulness of the schoolmaster was finished. It was time for something new and better! The old covenant of Moses reached the end of its limited life. Paul made this very plain in Colossians 2:14. "Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us. which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross" (kiv).

Time For Something New and Better?

Hebrews 7:18 For on the one hand there is an annulling of the former commandment because of its weakness and unprofitableness, 19 for the law made nothing perfect; on the other hand, there is the bringing in of a better hope, through which we draw near to God.



Kelly Blue Book reported last December that for the first time ever, the average price of a new car has soared past \$47,000.00. Unfortunately, for 2022, this upward NEW (15) (15) NEW LISED climb in price seems to be continuing. And not only has the price of new cars risen dramatically, so also the price of a used vehicle. According to a February USA

TODAY report, the average price of used cars and trucks has gone up by 40.5%. Many Americans would like to have a new and better car but have made the decision to sit on the sideline and just hope for the prices of vehicles to drop. While this makes sense financially, it can be problematic. Cars do wear out, then fail and reach the end of their usefulness.

In the first century, it was time for something new and better. There was a problem with the old. Not a car, but with the old covenant. It had reached the end of its useful life. And like an old car that once had been new and once served its purpose well, the old covenant made with Israel was not found faultless. The Hebrew writer explains, "For if that first covenant had been faultless, then no place would have been sought for a second. Because finding fault with them, He says: "Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah" (Hebrews 8:7-8).

Think about all the faults we can find with a used car. It is rare to find a used car that doesn't have something, even if it is minor, that needs to be fixed. The old covenant given to Moses for the people of Israel was given with a major fault that created the need for a new covenant. As Hebrews 10:1 states, "For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, make those who approach perfect." Hebrews 10:4 clearly defines this major fault: "For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins." This fault resulted in the need for the priests to act daily. "And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins" (Hebrews 10:11). The fault wasn't directly in the law as it came from God. But the law depended on man keeping it perfectly, which man proved unable to do; thus, showing that man needed God's help and a new and better covenant.



YLGO, 53990 Have you ever purchased a vehicle that just couldn't be fixed? Do you remember the Yugo? American Yugo dealers and repair shops soon came to the conclusion that there

was no amount of changes or repairs that could overcome the vehicle's poor quality and weaknesses. The car had only a low

mileage history of reliability. After 10,000 miles, the car was prone to failures. It was so notoriously limited that the rear window defroster was reportedly there to keep your hands

warm when you needed to push the vehicle in winter. When the old covenant was given to Moses, it was not designed to be the last. It had a limited life (Hebrews 7:18-19) (continued on page 4)
